- Botanically interesting Something that can tell a story







- Upright cultivar
- Specimen, vertical accent, massing, hedging, small spaces, streetscapes
- Height: 60 feet (18m)
- Spread: 6 feet (2m)
- Full sun to partial shade
- Tolerates urban conditions
- Outstanding fall colours
- Minimal to no fruit production

Liquidambar styraciflua 'Slender Silhouette'





- Fragrant blooms late Aug-Sept
- Pyramidal clusters white flowers
- Sun to partial shade
- Height & spread 20-30 feet (6-9m)
- Similar effect as tree lilac
- Attractive fall colour deciduous
- Attracts butterflies
- Tough adapts to soils drought tolerant
- No known pests or diseases













- Specimen shade tree
- Height: 40-50 (12-15m)
- Spread: 20-30' (6-9m)
- Hairy leaves & corky bark
- Flowers (showy catkins) in early spring
- Great structure = minimal pruning required
- Tolerates urban conditions heat, cold, drought, pollution













- Blooms late Aug-Sept
- White flowers with purple spotting
- Partial full shade
- Height & spread 2-2.5 feet (60-75cm)
- Excellent companion for *Hosta*
- Low maintenance medium water
- Requires moist organically rich soil
- Very easy to grow spreads over time
- Few pests occasionally slugs
- Unique flower







Tricyrtis 'Empress'
Toad Lily





- 'Near threatened' in wild
- Sacred tree in Asia for centuries
- First accession at RBG
- Hardier than most think
- Height: 50-60m (164-196')
- Lots of interesting cultivars







Cryptomeria japonica





- Inconspicuous green flowers spring
- Height 40-60 feet (12-18m) spread
   25-30feet (7-10m)
- Very striking glossy dark leaves
- Dense, symmetrical oval crown
- Drought tolerant & super urban tough
- No known pets or diseases
- Superb specimen, shade or street tree
- Super low maintenance requirements
- My girls are looking for a man!








Eucommia ulmoides Hardy Rubber Tree





- Height & spread:
  - 36" x 48"
- Reliable blooms late Aug-Sept
- Pure white flowers huge
- Colour not affected by pH
- Great fall colours!



Hydrangea paniculata 'ILVOBO' BOBO®





- 2006 American Peony Society Gold Medal
- Yellow double-semi double flowers in late spring – early summer – lemony fragrance
- Full sun adaptable to soil types
- Drought tolerant little maintenance dead head
- Hardy and easy to grow superb for borders – cut flowers – accent plant – deer/rabbit resistance, landscape, massed or specimen plantings
- Highly sought after plant







Paeonia 'Bartzella'





- 2007 introduction by PlantSelect®,
   Colorado
- Full sun to part shade
- Height & spread: 15-18' (4.5-5.5m)
- Strong branching
- Low maintenance drought & heat tolerance
- Bright red fruits that persist 6+ weeks
- Small space tree, under power lines





Acer tataricum
'GarAnn' HOT WINGSTM





- The finest of all lilacs blooms mid-late May
- Double white flowers with pink over tones and pink buds produce wonderful fragrance
- Upright multi-stemmed shrub 10-12 feet (3-4 m) tall and 8 feet (2.5m) spread
- Requires full sun and good air movement
- Adapts to urban pollution, a range of soil conditions but needs good drainage
- Ideal for landscape and mass planting in green spaces, garden use and hedges and screens

## Parrotia persica





- Double white blooms early-late spring
- Height 12 inches (30cm) & clump forming
- Tolerates full sun to full shade
- Needs good drainage, humus rich soil
- Drought tolerant and deer resistant
- Mixed beds, shade gardens, woodland margins, en masse and naturalizing
- Evergreen foliage











- Wide-spread North American native
- Becoming one of North America's most used ornamental grasses
- Lots of natural variations & sports
- Interest in 4 seasons
- Hot & sunny locations
- Soil adaptable & drought tolerance
- Not favoured by deer? Really?
- Walters Gardens introduction
- Upright growth into late fall
- Good red to dark purple autumn colours

Schizachyrium scoparium 'Smoke Signal'





- Bright yellow panicles bloom July-Aug
- Seed pods ripen Sep-Oct
- Height and spread 30-40 feet (9-12m)
- Needs full sun no shade
- Adapt to nutritionally poor soils
- Attracts bees and pollinators. No known pest problems
- Tolerates pollution & drought
- Good street/parking lot tree







Koelreuteria paniculata Golden Rain Tree





- Full sun to partial shade
- Perennial bed or container
- Crisp, textured green foliage in tight clusters – choke out weeds!
- Blooms throughout summer
- Consistently heavy flower production a pollinator's dream
- Deadhead for more flowers
- Very easy to grow easily divided
- Not well known or widely cultivated but it should be!
- Mint family (*Lamiaceae*) but not a thug like some we know!

Stachys officinalis 'Hummelo'





- Electric blue blooms in from July Oct
- Good in hot dry sites drought tolerant
- Grows on a diverse range of soils
- Is cold hardy and compact
- Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies –
  is resistant to deer
- Perfect for borders, perennial and rock gardens, mass plantings, containers and cut flowers
- Super easy care perennial with virtually no problems









- Proven performer
- Pyramidal with low hanging branches
- Excellent specimen tree
- Delicate texture for a spruce due to the short needles
- Grows well in a wide range of soil types if well drained
- Few pests & diseases
- Spring interest yellow new growth







Picea orientalis

'Aurea'





- Fragrant blooms late Aug-Sept
- Height and spread 19 feet (6m)
- Full sun but tolerates shade
- Attractive deeply veined glossy leaves
- Deep red calyces follow flowers
- Attractive papery bark exfoliates
- Early formative pruning = multi stem
- Drought tolerant, no known P & D
- Beds, borders, roadside, parking lot or outstanding specimen plant













- Trifoliate maple like Acer griseum (paperbark maple)
- One of many species discovered by Charles Maries
- Small to medium size tree
  - 20 40 feet tall
- Outstanding fall colour










Acer maximowiczianum 🦋
