A preventive control plan (PCP) may be submitted in lieu of this CA provided it contains all of the elements described below. ## 2.0 Specific Requirements

The facility named in section 1.0 agrees to adhere to the following conditions:

- a. The facility will designate one individual to be the Pest Control Manager (PCM). The PCM will be responsible for:
  - i. ensuring that the elements of this compliance agreement are followed
  - ii. ensuring that the staff designated in section 1.0 are adequately trained to inspect for and identify the life stages of gypsy moth
  - iii. reporting any find of gypsy moth on product or within the facility to the CFIA
- b. The general facility area and current nursery stock inventory will be inspected for gypsy moth egg masses prior to the start of larval emergence (typically late April to early June). New nursery stock entering the facility will be inspected for all stages of gypsy moth upon arrival. Inspection will include both the plant material and associated material (pots, burlap, leafy debris, mulch, etc.)
- c. During shipping season, inventories of nursery stock within the facility will be monitored for all stages of gypsy moth at least once every 2 weeks. Ongoing environmental scouting and the use of pheromone traps during the gypsy moth flight period (typically July to mid-September) are encouraged, but not mandatory.
- d. The CFIA must be notified when any life stage of gypsy moth is confirmed within the facility, and a preventive control plan (PCP) developed and implemented. The PCP will describe the enhanced control measures which will be implemented by the facility; such measures will be commensurate with the level of infestation. The PCP will be developed in cooperation with the CFIA, and its implementation will need to be complete prior to the start or continuation of shipments under this agreement.
- e. Plant material moving from the facility to an unregulated area of Canada or the United States is subject to inspection and may only be moved under the authorization of the CFIA. This authorization will be in the form of either a movement certificate (domestic) or phytosanitary certificate (export).
- f. In the event of non-compliance, movement or export certification may be refused, and valid movement certificates or phytosanitary certificates may be revoked.
- g. The facility is responsible for maintaining records of inspection, treatment, and training activities performed during each calendar year. These records must be maintained for 2 years and made available to the CFIA upon request.
